JOINT LIVING AND WORK QUARTERS

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FINDINGS

The Zoning Ordinance describes two different types of uses in each zoning district: 1) permitted uses; and 2) conditional uses. Conditional uses are those which require special consideration from the City. The Conditional Use Permit (CUP) process provides the City with the flexibility to determine if a specific use at a certain location will be compatible with the neighborhood. Conditional Use Permits can only be granted if all of the following findings can be made.

Joint living and work quarters is defined as residential occupancy by not more than four persons, maintaining a common household of one or more rooms or floors in a building originally designed for industrial or commercial occupancy which includes: (1) cooking space and sanitary facilities which satisfy the provisions of other applicable codes; and (2) adequate working space reserved for, and regularly used by, one or more persons residing therein. In the S-16 Industrial-Residential Transition Combining Zone, joint living and work quarters may also be allowed in new construction.
