RESOLUTION NO. _____ C.M.S.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, TO ACCEPT SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) FROM THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL (CHP) TO ASSIST IN THE CITY’S TRAFFIC STOP DEMOGRAPHIC DATA COLLECTION EFFORTS, AND APPROPRIATING SAID FUNDS TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the California Highway Patrol has received grant funds to distribute monies to participating California local law enforcement agencies to offset the costs created by traffic stop demographic data collection; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland is located within the geographic area where data collection is to occur and has volunteered to submit our data to the State; and

WHEREAS, Oakland Police Officers have been collecting demographic information during traffic stops since March 2000; and

WHEREAS, the \$75,000 in grant money available to the Oakland Police Department will permit the Department to offset some of the expenses incurred in setting up and maintaining the data base; and

WHEREAS, the collection of demographic data is important in acting as a deterrent to racial profiling; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council of the City of Oakland expresses its support in the collection of traffic stop demographic data; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council authorizes the City Manager to accept \$75,000 in grant funds from the California Highway Patrol; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the grant monies will be maintained in Fund: 299 / Org.: 102080 / Account 46229 / Program: PS, a Project Number will be established for the grant funds, and the estimated budget and appropriation to the Police Department will be increased by the amount of the grant.
