

## YOUTH SERVICES CATEGORY

### DISTRICT 1

#### School Based Programs for Youth

<b>District 1 is interested in Programs that Address the Needs that are Overwhelming Kindergarten-5th Grade Teachers and after school programs.</b>
In particular programs that work to reduce barriers to student achievement through support for parents in the form of assistance with the educational process, support for parent participation and training for parent participation.
In particular programs that create teamwork between teachers and parents including better communication with parents as it relates to missing assignments and any learning issues or student behavior problems at school.
In particular programs that provide teachers with supplies, more prep time or down time.
In particular programs that provide physical education during school hours, increase the health of students and provide better nutrition for students.
In particular programs that increase adult supervision or adult participation in the classroom
In particular After School Programs with Homework Assistance, a mix of Physical and Fun activities with healthy food and refreshments that connect with the Oakland Office of Parks
<i>Priority will be given to proposals that foster the creation of, or strengthen Parent Teacher Groups.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that include conflict resolution.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that assist teachers and parents with behavior issues.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide training and organization for Volunteers.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide daycare for volunteers and participants.</i>

#### Job Training for Youth ages 16-25

<b>District 1 is interesting in Programs that provide job training for youth ages 16-25</b>
In particular, District 1 is looking for programs that provide soft skills training including training on the appropriate attitude towards working and holding a job.
In particular, District 1 is looking for programs that train youth in fields that provide a living wage such as biotech, electronics, medical technicians, green jobs, EMTs, and Medical
In particular, District 1 is looking for programs that provide childcare for participants, flexible hours and stipends during instruction.
<i>Priority will be given for programs that provide analysis of barriers to employment including for those who did not find employment after completing the program.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide case management-particularly for emancipated youth.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that also assist participants to complete their GED or High School Diploma.</i>

**DISTRICT 2****Jobs and Job Readiness for Youth**

<b>District 2 is interested in programs that provide apprenticeship programs and programs that create a transition from high school to living wage employment.</b>
In particular, programs that provide on the job training or stipends during training.
In particular, programs that provide soft skills training as it relates to taking direction, taking initiative and working with the public.

In particular, in programs that provide professional experience in advance of students making choices regarding education and/or vocational training
In particular, in programs that rotate students through several industries with the option to focus on one with an apprenticeship or internship

<b><i>District 3 is interested in proposals that increase the job readiness of young adults in Western Oakland through the bridging of education and employment programs.</i></b>
<i>In particular, District 3 would like to see on-the-job training that leads to direct permanent jobs in the green industry.</i>
<i>In particular, District 3 is looking for programs that provide and facilitate placement in local summer jobs for teens in the green industry.</i>
<i>In particular, District 3 is looking for programs that work with Truancy to help parents to motivate young adults.</i>
<i>In particular, District 3 is looking for programs that provide services that assist parents participate and access their young adult's training programs and educational services.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to proposals that illustrate a coordination with schools that facilitate a continuity of programs from schools to the job training programs</i>
<i>Priority will be given to proposals that illustrate parent involvement.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to proposals that show collaboration between existing programs.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to proposals that train participants in emergency training/Citizens of Oakland Respond to Emergencies (CORE).</i>

**DISTRICT 4**

**Youth and Young Adults**

<b><i>District 4 is interested in Services and Programs for Youth and Young Adults ages 16-24 that result in less loitering and reducing problems around drinking establishments including the use and sale of drugs.</i></b>
<i>District 4 is particularly interested in programs that provide training or activities (including sports, arts and music) to at risk youth and young adults who would otherwise be found on street corners.</i>
<i>District 4 is particularly interested in programs that provide job training, summer jobs and/or internships to at risk youth and young adults.</i>
<i>District 4 is particularly interested in programs that train youth in trades and/or provide apprenticeships.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide extensive outreach to youth loitering on the street.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide case management and follow through with participants after employment or completion of the program.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that make the connection between youth on the street and existing and proposed programs.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide follow up with youths steered to other activities.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that propose a collaborative approach to the problem of loitering youth and young adult.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that engage in outreach to local businesses and neighborhood groups.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that inform police regarding the services provided and that collaborate with police to steer youth to appropriate non-penal services and programs.</i>

**DISTRICT 5**

**Youth and Young Adults**

<b>District 5 is interested in proposals that provide services for Youth and Young Adults.</b>
<i>In particular programs that introduce job training for youth and young parolees.</i>
<i>In particular programs that offer increased after-school learning, life skill choices, leadership choices, parent partnering with programs that serve at risk youth</i>
<i>In particular programs that provide extended hours of operation during the summer months, after school programs and Saturday programs.</i>
<i>In particular programs that provide employment opportunities for youth and young adults including young parolees</i>
<i>In particular programs that provide economic support for artist in the community.</i>

**DISTRICT 6**

**Youth and Young Adults**

<b>District 6 is interested in programs that connect youth, young adults and parents through existing and/or new afterschool programs</b>
In particular programs that coordinate with existing facilities that offer throughout the year, afterschool tutoring, computer training, career training, mentoring and programs that serve at-risk youth.
<i>Priority will be given to programs that illustrate collaboration between schools and existing community programs that provide services to assist youth and young adults.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that provide services that assist parents and provide tutoring and mentoring programs for their children.</i>
<i>Priority will be given to programs that offer food distribution and meal programs for school aged children during non-school hours throughout the summer.</i>

**DISTRICT 7**

**Youth and Young Adults**

<b>District 7 is interested in proposals that provide services for youth.</b>
In particular a safe place for youth to learn and to enjoy physical recreation.
In particular expansion of existing youth programs that serve the needs of children, youth and young adults that provide computer training programs, tutorial programs.
In particular programs that provide job training to address employment for youth and young adult parolees ages 15 to 25 years of age.
<i>Priority will be given to programs that address the need for expanded or new learning centers, and recreational centers for youth and their families</i>

In particular, District 3 would like to see programs increase the number of green jobs and green businesses, in particular, urban farming for Oakland grown products that helps promote the local economy.

In particular, District 3 would like to see programs that provide healthy alternatives to junk food for kids including urban farming that can be run by youth.

In particular, District 3 would like to see programs that provide education to liquor stores on other alternatives to junk food to youth on their way to and from school.

**DISTRICT 4**

## CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT CATEGORY

### DISTRICT 1

#### Independent Living for Seniors

**District 1 is interesting in proposals that provide Independent Living for Seniors**

In particular programs that provide home repair and improvement for low income seniors.

### DISTRICT 3

#### Infrastructure for Youth (Ages 11-13 and 14-18)

***District 3 is interested in proposals that increase the capacity for Youth Recreation in Western Oakland for children between the ages of 11 to 13 years of age and 14 to 18 years old.***

*In particular, District 3 would like to see proposals that develop new structures that are multipurpose and include recreation, community health, art, music and computer spaces.*

*In particular, District 3 is interested in projects that coordinate with existing facilities to increase their capacity.*

*Priority will be given to proposals that illustrate a connection with schools that facilitate a continuity of programs from school to non-school hours.*

*Priority will be given to proposals that show collaboration between existing programs and facilities.*

*Priority will be given to proposals that have facilities that support community health and well being.*

### DISTRICT 4

#### Parks and Recreation

***District 4 is interested in physical improvements to Parks and Recreation Facilities***

District 4 is particularly interested in improvements that provide a safe and well maintained environment for youth and their families including, but not limited to, chain link fences, bleacher repair, landscaping, gate repairs and/or playground resurfacing.

District 4 is particularly interested in programs that provide affordable and/or fee waivers for low income families to access park program activities.

**DISTRICT 7**

**Senior Center Improvements**

***Disrict 7 is interested in programs that provide assistance for capital improvements to the Senior Center Facility***

In particular interior renovations that include the following: refurbishing wall cabinets in the large recreation room, installation of permanent panels that divide rooms and installation of concrete benches in patio area.

In particular remove and/or renovate wall covering and re-painting in common areas along the corridor.
